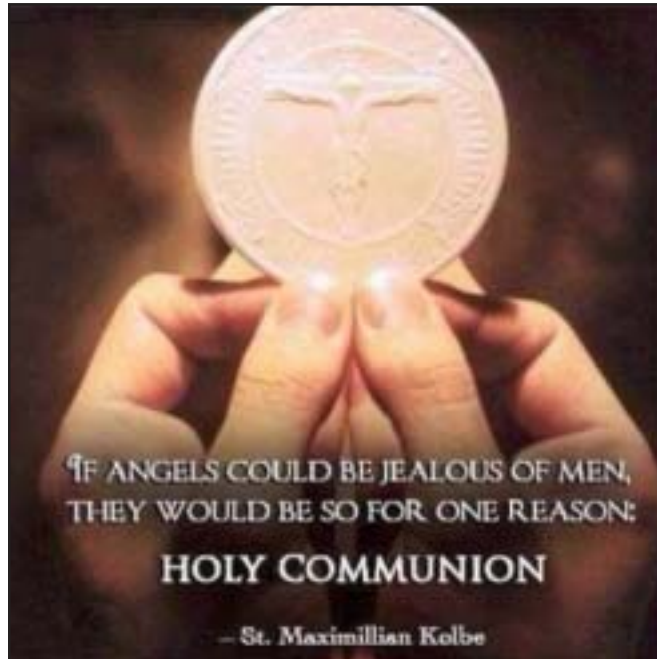

Scripture Reflection

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ



The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is the day we pay special homage to the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The bread that Jesus gives us is his life. On the night before he died he left his body and blood as spiritual food to be received in every generation. In this Gospel, John focuses on the personal dimension of Eucharist. To feed on the flesh of Jesus and to drink His blood is to remain in Him. To receive Eucharist is to be grounded in the life of Jesus. At the same time, John speaks of the Father who sent Jesus. To share in God's life means to share in God's life style. It is a sharing which is community oriented, since the Father's sending of the Son envisions others. Communion means community. Eucharist leads us to the question of how can I become food for others? As pilgrims on the road of life we suffer from many hungers but the greatest hunger of all is the yearning for a deeper meaning of life. This is something no earthly bread can satisfy. Eucharist is a great help because it is an invitation to follow in the footsteps of Jesus. The Eucharist proclaims that Christ died for our sins so that we might have life and salvation. The Son of God could not have given us a greater proof of His love. At each Mass each and every one of us are guests of the Lord. The one bread in which the lowly and highly exalted, the powerful and powerless, partake together. At the table of the Lord, there are no reservations needed. It makes brothers and sisters out of all of us. The Eucharist tells us that we are to live as brothers and sisters of Jesus. There is no way we can offer ourselves to God in the Eucharist and not try and love our neighbor who has failed us during the week. We are called to go out and touch the lives of others, to be the healing presence, the helping hand, the voice of sympathy and words of encouragement when they are needed. In this way we are formed by what we celebrate in Eucharist.

Policies Dealing with Allegations of Sexual Abuse

STANDARD

The Church of St. Joseph, Kings Park, NY, with its clergy and staff, is committed to fostering the dignity of children and young people and reasserts its commitment to creating a safe environment for children and youth. Therefore,

1. it is the moral obligation of all to report knowledge or reasonable suspicion of child abuse and
2. the pastoral responsibility of the diocese/parish to implement and enforce an internal program of clear, practical actions to require the reporting of suspected child abuse.

REPORTING AN INCIDENT

When a complaint of sexual abuse of a child or minor is brought to any person working for the Church, he or she is

1. to urge the complainant to notify the legal authorities immediately and assist the person to do so if the complainant wishes;
2. to call the legal authorities immediately after receiving whatever information has been provided;
3. to inform the diocesan Office of the Protection of Children and Young People at 516-678-5800 ext. 216/573. The person accepting the complaint will initiate the diocesan standardized incident report form, and as a precaution, also inform the legal authorities before beginning the preliminary internal investigation.

In an effort to ensure a response to those who wish to report incidents of sexual abuse of minors by members of the clergy, the Diocese of Rockville Centre has installed a dedicated telephone line for reporting of all cases. That phone number is (516) 594-9063. If the caller does not reach someone directly, messages can be left on an answering machine connected to the phone. Those messages will be retrieved by a member of the Intervention Team and returned as soon as possible.
