Scripture Reflection

13th Sunday In Ordinary Time



Elisha is welcomed by the Shunemmite woman. In appreciation for her kindness, the Lord showers favor on her. In our welcoming one another we welcome Jesus who won for us the victory over sin and evil. Almighty God presents us with two choices, light or darkness, life and death. All of us are called from death to life in Him. A self-indulgent society will have trouble understanding the gospel of today. A society that depends on excess and instant gratification will never experience the happiness inside self-discipline. Many of us spend time in "seeking self" and trying to make every aspect of our lives secure, we all tend to take care of ourselves first and avoid all risks. We end up in a dull self-centeredness. We have to risk giving ourselves to other people, to pour ourselves into life's adventures in ways that at times make us vulnerable. Very simple acts of acceptance become very significant acts of faith. Inviting Jesus into our lives and putting him first is a demanding task that involves a reshaping of our attitudes. It may mean coming to grips with years of our own selfishness and lack of self-discipline. Christ comes to our doors in many ways; sometimes we do not recognize Him. If we have not cracked open the hard shell of indifference to others, we run the risk of letting slip so many opportunities for soul making. When a stranger comes looking for help, our natural instinct tells us not to get involved or put ourselves to any trouble. Following Christ involves putting His way of life into practice and in a Christian community this means that everyone should feel welcome and there should be no strangers or outcasts, no elitist or special group status, no arrogant self-aggrandizing groups. Hospitality means showing a generosity of disposition and a willingness to interrupt our personal lives in order to perform some unrecorded act of kindness because it is not what is given that counts, but the heart with which it is given. The least we can do for Christ, who has accepted us in our sinfulness, is to receive one another with open arms. All of us are invited to the table of the Lord, no reservations necessary. When we respond to the compelling call for discipleship we allow His word to enter into our hearts and guide our every action.

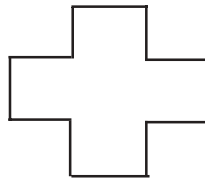
